MORNING SELFIE SPOT Arch Alley



[Arch Alley](#) is a renovated alley space that features three archways in the north alley of the downtown square. The three arches symbolize the different pathways for Jefferson and Greene County. There are also benches and a community poem on display. Artist David Williamson worked with Greene County students and adults, incorporating their work, Jefferson history & industry in the castings. The arches are lit up at night.

MORNING Mahanay Carillon Bell Tower



Take the elevator to the top of the [Mahanay Carillon Bell Tower](#), located on the southwest corner of the downtown square. The tower is 168 ft. 2 inches high and has a 4-octave carillon sounding every fifteen minutes. From the glass enclosed observation deck at 120 ft, view the RRVT bike trail and unique rooftop art. AFTERNOON RVP~1875 Historical Furniture Shop



Bike over to [RVP~1875](#), within minutes of the Bell Tower at 115 S. Wilson Ave. It has over 100 pieces of furniture, each with a story of historical significance. Dunkers by Matt

MORNING
Greene County Historical Museum



Immerse yourself in the legends and history of Greene County, preserved within the walls of the [Greene County Historical Museum](#). Located at 219 East Lincoln Way, the museum hours are on Wednesdays from 1 to 4 p.m. and on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 12 noon, from May 1 through October, and by appointment at (515) 386-8544 or (515) 386-2155. The tower is 168 ft. 2 inches high and has a 4-octave carillon sounding every fifteen minutes. From the glass enclosed observation deck at 120 ft, view the historic downtown square and unique rooftop art. Ask the guide for a tour of the Greene County Courthouse, listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Call 515-386-2155 for more information.

AFTERNOON
Interactive Presentation of the History of Iowa

[Dunbar Slough](#) is 2,289 acres stretching about five miles from north to south and a half-mile from east to west. It attracts hundreds of different species including trumpeter swans, falcons, songbirds, marsh birds and eagles. It was named an Important Bird Area by the Audubon Society. AFTERNOON
Spring Lake Park



The wooded area of the park as well as the waterfowl using the lake creates a popular location to view wildlife. Located at 1847 195th St., [Spring Lake Park](#) has over 2 miles of asphalt roads ideal for biking, jogging and walking. The wooded area also has several hiking trails. Grand Junction and Jefferson, Iowa



MORNING

Lion's Tree Park,
Grand Junction



Start your adventure at the [Lion's Tree Park](#) at the intersection of the new Highway 30 and the Lincoln Highway, just east of Grand Junction. There are interpretive panels along a short walking trail. Greene County was the first county in Iowa to grade, gravel, and pave its section. The original [route](#) ran through Grand Junction, Jefferson and Scranton. Several segments and structures through the country are on the National Register of Historic Places.

One block to the west of Thomas Jefferson Gardens is the [Mahanay Carillon Bell Tower](#). Get a bird's eye view of the Lincoln Highway by taking the elevator to the observation deck at the top of the tower. The tour guide will explain the history of the bell tower as well as the sites around Jefferson. Ask for a complimentary tour of the Greene County Courthouse. Be sure to visit the two renovated alleys on the north and south sides of the square as well as the [Greene County History Museum](#) at 219 E. Lincoln Way.

MID-MORNING

Greene County Courthouse



The [Greene County Courthouse](#) was dedicated in 1917 and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Some of its [prominent features and architecture](#) are modeled after State Capitols throughout the U.S. There are four canvas murals, two tiffany-inspired skylights and a floor mosaic. The courthouse grounds display sculptures, a Medal of Honor Memorial, a Medal of Honor Flag and Abraham Lincoln Stature.

LUNCH

Peony Chinese Restaurant



Just to the southwest of the courthouse is the [Peony Chinese Restaurant](#) at 101 E. Lincoln Way. Upon entering, notice "The Peonies" murals. It might be one of the best hidden gems in small town Iowa. Call (515) 386-3928 for information.

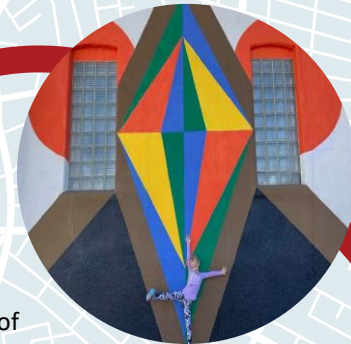
AFTERNOON

Renovated Alleys



After lunch, enjoy the richness of the art around the square. Located 1/2 block east of the Peony on Lincoln Way is [Sally's Alley](#) that features outdoor photography of Churdan native Sally White. Enlarged bird photos and original poetry are found throughout three small flower gardens and a lending library. Directly across the square on State St. is [Arch Alley](#). It features three archways which symbolize the different pathways for Jefferson and Greene County. Artist David Williamson worked with local students and adults, incorporating their work, Jefferson history and industry in the castings.

AFTERNOON Murals



Just steps to the north and east, is the mural "[Eyes on Washington Street](#)" designed by Roger Aegerter and painted by volunteers. Another 1/2 block to the north is the mural "[Jefferson](#)" at 302 N. Chestnut St, painted by high school students.
