Countdown Amy Cornwall #2 by James Patterson – A botched field operation reveals dark dealings between Agent Cornwall's bosses & an informant.

Dark Whisper Carpathian #36 by Christine Feehan – Vasilisa is a Lycan of royal blood. She knows what is expected of her, but all she wants is to be out from under her family's watchful eyes.

Dawnlands Fairmile #3 by Phillippa Gregory – In 1685, England is on the brink of a renewed civil war against the Stuart kings and many families are bitterly divided.

The Favor by Nicci French – A young woman agrees to do a favor for an estranged former boyfriend—but when things go horribly wrong, one small task turns into a murder investigation.

The Furies Charlie Parker #20 by John Connolly – Private investigator Charlie Parker becomes involved in two separate but connected cases.

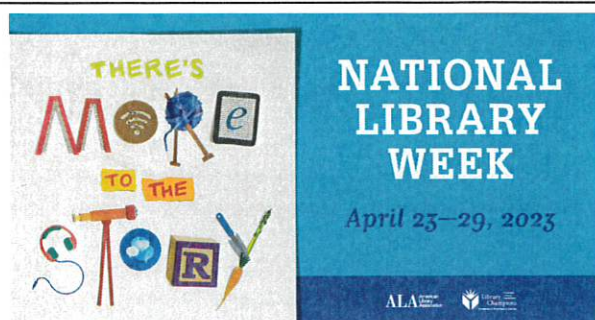

Hunting Time Colter Shaw #4 by Jeffrey Deaver – In his latest adventure, reward seeker Colter Shaw plunges into the woods and races the clock in a case where nothing is quite what it seems.

In Her Boots by K.J. Dell'Antonia – Rhett is about to turn 40 when her long-term relationship falls apart, and tragic news forces a return to the family farm.

I Will Find You by Harlan Coben – An innocent father serving life for the murder of his own son receives evidence that his child may still be alive, and must break out of prison to find out the truth.

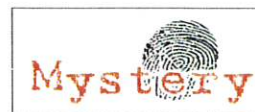
3 Days to Live by James Patterson – Three novellas in which the people closest to you can be enemies


