The Greene County

Courthouse was dedicated in 1917 and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Some of its prominent features and architecture are modeled after State Capitols throughout the U.S. There are four canvas murals, two tiffany-inspired skylights and a floor mosaic. The courthouse grounds display sculptures, a Medal of Honor Memorial, a Medal of Honor Flag and Abraham Lincoln Stature.

Just to the southwest of the courthouse is the Peony Chinese Restaurant at 101 E. Lincoln Way. Upon entering, notice "The Peonies" murals. It might be one of the best hidden gems in small town lowa. Call (515) 386-3928 for information.
